Re: 2013 Upinnaqtuq Awards

The Nunavut Law Foundation is proud to announce the recipients of the 2013 Upinnaqtuq Awards. The word "Upinnaqtuq" in Inuktitut means "to celebrate a person's accomplishments" or "a person you are proud of".

The Upinnaqtuq Awards were created in honour of Madame Justice Beverly Browne, who sat as a Territorial Court Judge in the Northwest Territories from 1990 until 1999 before becoming the first Senior Judge of the unified Nunavut Court of Justice upon Nunavut's creation until 2009.

The Upinnaqtuq Awards were created to commemorate Justice Browne's active volunteerism in Nunavut's communities, her commitment to social justice, and her particular dedication to working with youth. The Upinnaqtuq Award is awarded annually to students and youth throughout Nunavut who demonstrate qualities of leadership in conflict resolution or remarkable progress in rehabilitation.
