Dominique Nouvet is a self-employed specialist in Aboriginal law based in Victoria, British Columbia who has been practicing in Nunavut since 2018 and has been a member of the Law Society of British Columbia since 2002.

Dominique represents Indigenous governments and organizations, with a focus on negotiations and collaborative work with the Crown and industry and modern treaty implementation. She has also participated in various Supreme Court of Canada interventions and was part of the legal team representing the T̓silhqot'ın Nation at the Supreme Court of Canada, which resulted in the first declaration of Aboriginal title in Canada: 2014 SCC 44. While working at Woodward & Company, she wrote a new section for the *Native Law* looseleaf textbook about the duty to consult and accommodate. Dominique is committed to providing service to Aboriginal clients at below market rates.

Dominique attended Lester B. Pearson College of the Pacific on full scholarship, completed a Bachelor of Economics from McGill University, and then received a Bachelor of Law from the University of Toronto. She clerked with Justice Ian C. Binnie between 2000 – 2001 at the Supreme Court of Canada.
